PSC TO CONDUCT REHEARING ON WILHELM GRAIN CLAIMS

LINCOLN – The Nebraska Public Service Commission will conduct a rehearing on a grain dealer and warehouse claim against Wilhelm Grain of Humboldt.

The Commission voted June 1 to grant a motion by one of the claimants asking for the rehearing, which has been scheduled for 1:30 p.m., June 8, in the Commission Hearing Room at the Commission’s offices in downtown Lincoln.

Because the order granting the rehearing stays the 30-day appeal window for all grain depositors, the Commission’s goal of issuing payments by mid-summer for approved claim holders may be delayed.

First District Commissioner Frank Landis of Lincoln, who represents southeast Nebraska, said, “All the claimants in the case whose claims were denied have the right to have this matter re-examined by the Commission or a court of law. While this period of re-examination will take some time, it still is my hope we will be able to make a distribution of the funds within a reasonable time frame.”
