LUTTICH RECEIVES RV STANDARDS AWARD

LINCOLN – The Director of the Nebraska Public Service Commission’s Department of Housing and Recreational Vehicles has been named a recipient of the Distinguished Achievement in Recreation Vehicle Standards Award.

Mark Luttich of Lincoln has been director of Nebraska’s recreational vehicle regulatory unit for more than 25 years. The award was made by the Recreation Vehicle Industry Association (RVIA) of Reston, Virginia, and signifies outstanding contributions toward the advancement of standards in recreational vehicle manufacturing.

In notifying Luttich of the award, the Association said, “No other state agency has been more cooperative and involved in the effort to harmonize all recreational vehicle requirements with those adopted by RVIA.” The award was announced at a recent meeting of the association at Williamsburg, Virginia.

RVIA Board Chairman Bruce Hertzke of Forest City, Iowa, said, “Mark’s vision is to work very closely with RVIA, striving to allow recreational vehicle manufacturers to build products efficiently and be able to ship them anywhere within the United States.”

Nebraska has one recreational vehicle manufacturer, King of the Road near Bradshaw. The company is a division of Chief Industries of Grand Island. Luttich is a native Nebraskan and was raised in Fillmore County near Ohiowa and Geneva.
