PSC APPOINTS LOGSDON TO NUSF ADVISORY PANEL

LINCOLN – The director of regulatory affairs for Cox Communications of Omaha has been named by the Public Service Commission to its Nebraska Universal Service Fund advisory committee.

Robert Logsdon will serve a three-year term as a representative of the telecommunications industry. Cox provides competitive local exchange telecommunications in metropolitan Omaha as well as other communications services. He replaces Deonne Bruning, a Lincoln attorney. Members of the advisory panel are limited to two successive three-year terms.

The Nebraska Universal Service Fund is a state mechanism designed to make telecommunications services available at affordable in high cost areas. Among its programs are partial funding for Nebraska Tele-Health, the Nebraska Telephone Assistance Program, and a reduction in access rates charged by local telephone companies to users of the long distance network.

The advisory panel meets four times a year and makes recommendations to the Commission.
