**SOURCEGAS WORKSHOP SET BY PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION**

LINCOLN – Officials of SourceGas, the natural gas utility for most of the western two-thirds of Nebraska and the Public Service Commission will participate in a workshop on customer service issues next Tuesday at 2 p.m.

The workshop will be open to the public and will be conducted in the Commission Hearing Room at the Commission's offices in the Atrium, 1200 N Street, in downtown Lincoln.

Commissioner Rod Johnson of Sutton, who represents the eastern portion of SourceGas-served communities, said the workshop will provide all parties, including the public, an opportunity to see where the company is at in its conversion of billing and service since SourceGas' purchase of the former Kinder-Morgan franchise communities on May 14, 2007. SourceGas has franchise rights in 182 Nebraska communities.

Commissioner Jerry Vap of McCook, who represents the western part of SourceGas communities, said, "I've had several inquiries about billing problems. These need to be taken care of immediately."

Johnson said he is among the SourceGas customers who experienced billing problems. "I haven't received a billing from SourceGas since August."

Johnson added, "I would encourage anyone who has problems or concerns to attend and participate in the workshop."
