PSC HIRES TWO NEW GRAIN EXAMINERS

LINCOLN – Two grain examiners have been hired by the Nebraska Public Service Commission.

Chris Lenz of Grand Island and Clayton Swantek of Genoa will bring the total grain examiner staff to five full-time, a full complement for the Commission's Grain Warehouse Department.

Lenz graduated from the University of Nebraska at Kearney with a major in criminal justice in 2003 following completion of his high school years at Grand Island High School in 1998. He worked at the Hastings Correctional Center before subsequently transferring to the Hastings Regional Center and then to the regional office of the Department of Health and Human Services in Grand Island.

Swantek completed an agricultural business major at Platte Community College in Columbus in May of this year. He graduated from Twin River High School in Genoa in 2007.

Both men have ties to agriculture in their backgrounds. Swantek will work only as a grain examiner while Lenz will serve as both a grain examiner and moisture meter inspector. Both men will also conduct soybean checkoff audits.
